



2010 COLLEGE ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

POLANKI's annual College Achievement Awards Competition recognizes students who have demonstrated high academic achievement and are committed to understanding, preserving, or disseminating Polish culture and/or language.

To be eligible for consideration, an applicant should be:

1. a U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident,
2. a junior, senior or graduate student in an accredited degree program during the 2009-2010 academic year,
3. a Wisconsin resident or attending a Wisconsin college or university, and
4. of Polish ancestry, OR studying Polish language, history, society, or culture, OR significantly engaged with Polish culture.

Successful applicants usually have a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a four point scale. Individuals may receive a maximum of two awards in their academic career. Past winners may re-apply (1) as graduate students, if they previously received an award as an undergraduate; OR (2) if they have completed the course of study for which they received a past award and are pursuing a new degree in another accredited degree program.

The following awards may be offered, in amounts ranging from \$750 to \$1,500:

- **Stanley F. and Helen Balcerzak Award:** for an outstanding student in any field
- **Janet Dziadulewicz Branden Memorial Award:** for an outstanding student in Polish Studies
- **Copernicus Award:** for an outstanding student in a science field
- **Arthur B. Gurda Memorial Award**
- **Msgr. Alphonse S. Popek Memorial Award**
- **Evelyn Appleyard Memorial Award**
- **Edward and Rita Michalak Award**
- **Robert J. Leonard Memorial Award:** for a student engaged in dance or theater
- **Polanki College Achievement Awards and Memorial Awards**
- **UWM Polish American Scholarship Award:** open to UW-Milwaukee students
- **John R. Plewa Memorial Award:** for an outstanding UW-Milwaukee student in history or political science
- **Harriet Gostomski Memorial Award:** for a UW-Milwaukee student
- **Michael and Maria Laskowski Memorial Award:** for a graduate student or a senior intending to attend graduate school at Marquette University, excluding the schools of dentistry and law. Marquette University matches the award with a tuition waiver

PLEASE NOTE: When applying, you need not specify any particular award. The Awards Committee will automatically consider you for all applicable awards.

To apply, send to the address below:

1. **one original application form**, appropriately filled out,
2. **one transcript** issued by the college, **for each college attended**,
3. **one copy each of the essays** required in questions 12 and 13 on the application form. NOTE: In preparing your essays, make sure to **follow closely and thoughtfully the instructions in questions 12 and 13.**

Choose one of the following topics. **Research** the topic of your choice at your college library, on the internet, and elsewhere (if applicable), making sure to explore **sources of different kinds**. **Understand** and **critically analyze** whatever you find through research. Write an engaging, well-organized essay of **500-600 words** to present **your position** on the topic you choose. In your essay, properly **identify all your sources and attribute opinions to authors or websites**. Clearly express and identify your own opinions as your own. **Include a list of all the sources** you relied on in writing your essay.

A. Young Poland today.

Read about Poland and its society in the past 25 years. Review recent Polish and foreign news coverage about Poland and its society, especially young Poles. Then write a report about "Poland today" as experienced by young Polish people, focusing on one or two issues of interest to you. Feel free to offer supported opinions and comparisons with young people outside of Poland.

B. Poland's contribution to sciences or the humanities.

Discover a little-known Polish contributor to a scientific or humanistic endeavor – someone other than Maria Skłodowska-Curie or Mikołaj Kopernik (Copernicus), Fryderyk Chopin, Lech Wałęsa, Tadeusz Kościuszko, Kazimierz (Casimir) Pułaski, or Pope John Paul II. Research that person and his/her achievement. Offer your opinion about the effect of that achievement on science, technology, industry, society, or the arts -- in Poland and globally -- and offer support for that opinion.

C. Modern Polish culture and me.

Get to know and understand one Polish literary piece, musical composition, or movie created in the past 50 years. Research the author(s) and the artistic-cultural background of the work. Describe the work and its cultural context. State your personal reaction(s) to the work. Offer thoughts about the work's appeal or value to Polish and American audiences.

NOTE: If you become a winner of this year's College Achievement Awards Competition, POLANKI may wish to publish your essay(s), properly attributed to you as a winner, in its member newsletter. By submitting your essays, you agree to such publication. You also agree to receiving your award, in person or by proxy, during the Awards Tea on April 25, 2010, at the Polish Center in Franklin, WI.

13. In 100-150 words outline your personal, academic and professional plans for the future.
